- Consult with industry and stakeholders as part of the public inquiry process and any hearings.
- Following receipt of submissions or hearings, preparing a final report for submission the Minister by NICTA identifying.
 - NICTAs recommendation whether the national numbering plan should be amended to implement mobile number portability in any form
 - o the basis for NICTA's recommendation
 - o the proposed form of rules or amendments to the national numbering plan
 - e the costs and benefits of implementing that form of number portability

The project is expected to be undertaken as follows:

- Collection of data to assist in the assessment of costs and benefits and in the development of a discussion document to accompany public consultation;
- Publication of the discussion paper and commencement of the public consultation process is expected approximately in September 2016.
- A public consultation period of around 4 weeks will be set for industry and public submissions commenting on the discussion document
