## INTERNATIONAL GIRLS IN ICT DAY

## THEME: Leadership

oday we celebrate the International Girls in ICT Day with the theme "Leadership." The International Girls in ICT Day is earmarked by the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) for every last Thursday of April annually, at a national level.

This day gives prominence to the efforts by the government and stakeholders alike in recognizing and encouraging participation of more girls and women in the area of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).

The government of Prime Minister James Marape through my Ministry of Information and Communication Technology call on all our stakeholders, industry players and development partners to join in the celebrations by appreciating the roles of women and girls in the ICT.

This year's theme "Leadership" challenges us to look at where our females are in the fields of ICT and STEM, especially in supervisory and leadership roles. The theme also provides us with an opportunity to encourage more women participation in leadership roles in these fields.

This year's global theme stands to achieve these goals for Girls in ICT;

- ☐ Encourage girls and young women to pursue Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM).

Our country still faces significant challenges such as expanding access to digital services, improving the quality of ICT infrastructure, access to reliable

and affordable digital infrastructure and services. These are some major areas that we all must work together to resolve those challenges.

Let us commemorate this day, aimed at encouraging girls and young women to pursue careers in the dynamic field of ICT. For us in Papua New Guinea, it is also about bridging the digital divide by addressing the disparity of human capacity in technology.

I commend girls who are currently pursuing ICT studies, and women who are in the ICT sector serving as ICT professionals. I urge you all to work hard in ensuring a safe ICT sector for everyone.

I wish all the Girls in the ICT field, a successful journey in their career Paths and would like to also encourage NICTA in collaboration with the Department of Information and Communication Technology (DICT), and other key stakeholders to continue the Girls in ICT initiative.

I look forward to building a dynamic human capacity that is crucial to PNG digital aspirations by way of re-emphasizing NICTA's on-going commitment towards this agenda of encouraging more girls to step into the field of ICT and STEM.
